## Fieldwork Educator Preparation

- [AOTA Official Document | Occupational Therapy Fieldwork Education: Value and Purpose](#)  
This official AOTA statement frames fieldwork as the bridge that moves students into the practitioner role, building competence in the OT process and evidence-based intervention with diverse clients across medical, educational, research, administrative, and community settings, while also seeding emerging areas of practice.

AOTA's landing page collecting its fieldwork tools in one place, including the Self-Assessment Tool for Fieldwork Educator Competency (SAFECom), guidance on Level I and Level II supervision and site-specific objectives, the Fieldwork Educators Certificate Workshop, and Medicare student-supervision rules.
- [Fieldwork Educator Regional Workshops](#)  
AOTA's in-person, regionally hosted version of the Fieldwork Educator Certificate Program, an interactive workshop covering supervision, the educator role, and student assessment that practitioners complete to formalize their fieldwork-educator credentials.
- [Self-paced Fieldwork Educators Training](#) (7 hour AOTA-approved CEU course)  
An on-demand alternative to the live workshop, delivering the same AOTA-approved fieldwork-educator curriculum (roughly seven contact hours) entirely online so practitioners can earn the credential at their own pace without scheduling around an in-person session.
- [Preceptor Education Program for Students and Health Professionals](#) (eCampus Ontario)  
The Preceptor Education Program is a free online program for clinical instructors and students preparing for clinical placements. Once registered, users can access the PEP program anytime. Each module takes about 30 minutes to complete and includes quick tips and downloadable learning activities. Completion earns one PDU for NBCOT certification. This is a low-barrier, no-cost preparation option particularly useful for first-time fieldwork educators.
